HORTICULTURE 1

- GRADUATION REQUIREMENT MET: Elective
- PREREQUISITE: None
- GRADE LEVELS: 10, 11, or 12
- CREDITS: .5 per semester
- This class is designed to examine food and fiber production systems landscaping, introduction to the floral industry, plant structure and function, as well as horticulture's vast role and versatility in today's world. This class will be a very hands-on experience with a great deal of team, as well as individual projects. Students will put the many aspects of the horticulture industry into practice through creating actual designs. There will also be careers investigation in these industries. This course is offered to juniors and seniors as concurrent enrollment with Eastern New Mexico University.



HORTICULTURE 2

- GRADUATION REQUIREMENT MET: Elective
- PREREQUISITE: Horticulture I and submit an updated resume and letter of recommendation, Instructor approval
- GRADE LEVELS: 11 or 12 CREDITS: .5 per semester
- The intended purpose of this course is for students to learn the basics of the horticulture plant production and gain experience in the field of floral design. Floral Design is a year-long course that is intended to prepare students to enter the floral industry. Instruction includes the science of plant production as well as marketing, developing design principles, and conducting successful business management practices. Students will have the opportunity to test for the West Texas New Mexico Floral Association Certification. By the end of the semester, students should have completed substantial participation in FFA floriculture team activities, which not only provides potential scholarship, but also incorporates leadership development opportunities.
